DOUGLAS REITSMA SURVEYING LTD. on behalf of DIMARCANTONIO AND SONS LIMITED to rezone Part Lot 22, Concession 7, former Township of Crowland for lands at 611 Southworth Street from the existing C1 - Local Commercial Zone By-law 2667 to a Site Specific R3 Zone By-law 2667. The purpose of the Amendment is to satisfy two (2) Decisions for Consent to Convey. Part 2 on the sketch will have a Site Specific R3 Zone to provide for a 0.97 metre front yard setback for the existing dwelling. Part 1 will require a frontage of 11.7 metres. The Official Plan designation is RESIDENTIAL (R). The subject lands are also the subject of an Application for Committee of Adjustment - Consent - Files B015/2001WELL and B016/2001WELL.

Councillor Mastroianni outlined the procedures of the Public Hearings as required by the Planning Act. T. Fitzpatrick confirmed that the statutory requirements for public hearing had been met, summarized the purpose of the hearing and reviewed the Planning Division Report.
