WELLAND FIRE CHIEF SAYS BEING PREPARED IS KEY TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Welland, ON - Natural disasters may be beyond our control, but there are ways to reduce the risk and the impact of whatever emergency we might face. Emergency Preparedness Week (May 5-11, 2019) encourages Canadians to take action and be better prepared to protect themselves and their families during emergencies. Emergency Preparedness Week is a national effort for provincial, regional, and municipal governments to promote public safety,

“Be ready,” said Brian Kennedy, Welland’s Fire Chief and Community Emergency Management Coordinator. “By taking a few simple steps, members of the community can be better prepared to cope with natural emergencies.”

It is important to:

- Know the risks – Although the consequences of disasters can be similar, knowing the risks specific to your area can help you make a plan.
- Make a plan – It will help you and your family know what to do.
- Get an emergency kit – During an emergency, you will need some basic supplies because you might be without power or tap water. Be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours in an emergency.

Alert Ready is scheduled to issue a test message on May 8, 2019 in all provinces and territories. The Alert Ready emergency alerting system will be issued through television, radio and, compatible wireless devices.
